

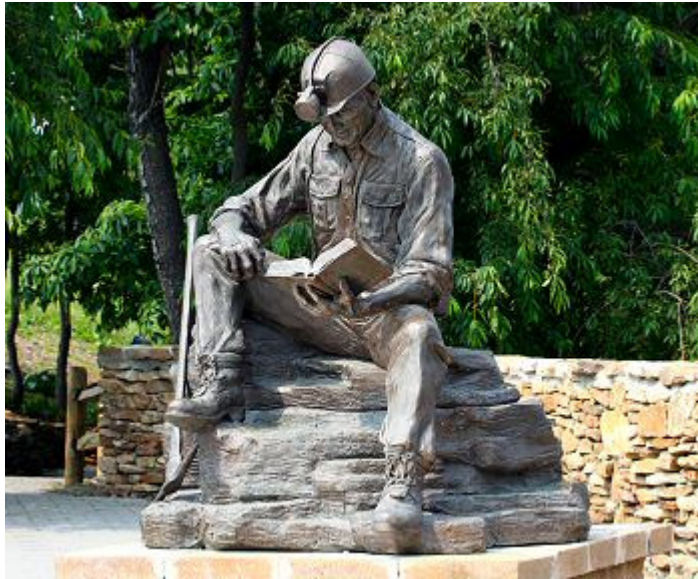

ENGINEERING ETHICS IN PERMITTING: HOW FAR MUST AN ENGINEER GO?

Presented By: *MICHAEL J. HEILMAN, ESQUIRE, Assistant Regional Counsel for the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, Southwest Regional Office, Office of Chief Counsel.*

Engineers are regularly hired to prepare permit applications for a myriad of activities, and to submit them to government agencies on behalf of clients. Typically the application preparation



focuses on practical questions like, is the application timely and will it satisfy the agency reviewers. However, does the preparation of permit applications also have ethical implications for engineers? This presentation will pose questions that focus on the ethical obligations of engineers in the context of permitting. A case study related to a southwestern Pennsylvania coal mine, where a crew of miners were trapped and successfully rescued, will be used to stimulate the discussion.
