Join us for a tour of the USDA Forest Service Fernow Experimental Forest!

Included as part of the trip, on Saturday October 7th Melissa Thomas-Van Gundy, PhD, Project Leader and Research Forester at US Forest Service, will provide a guided hiking tour of the nearby Fernow Experimental Forest. Established in 1934, the 4600-acre forest has been the subject of decades of scientific study to better understand the important role of forest management in maintaining healthy forest ecosystems, maintaining water quality, and balancing watershed hydrologic processes.
